

**Ordinance No. 10-005**

**An ordinance changing the zoning classification on certain property known as 2351 East Arkansas Lane by the approval of specific use permit SUP09-23 for gas drilling; amending the Zoning District Map accordingly; providing for a fine of up to \$2,000.00 for each violation; providing this ordinance be cumulative; and providing for severability, governmental immunity, injunctions, publication, and an effective date.**

WHEREAS, after notice and public hearing the Planning and Zoning Commission heard case SUP09-23 and recommended approval of the specific use permit on November 11, 2009;

WHEREAS, after notice and public hearing, and upon consideration of the recommendation of the Commission and of all testimony and information submitted during the public hearing, the City Council has determined that the use will: complement or be compatible with the surrounding uses and community facilities; contribute to, enhance or promote the welfare of the area of the SUP and adjacent properties; not be detrimental to the public health, safety or general welfare; and conform in all other respects to all applicable zoning regulations and standards; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the public and in support of the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens that the zoning amendment be approved. Now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARLINGTON, TEXAS:

1.

A Specific Use Permit for gas drilling is hereby granted for the property known as 2351 East Arkansas Lane, described in Exhibit A, and the Zoning District Map shall be amended to reflect the zoning change made by this ordinance. Development and use of the property shall be in compliance with this ordinance, the conditions stated in Exhibit B, and the attached site plan. In the event of a conflict between the provisions in Exhibit B and the provisions in any other exhibit, the provisions in Exhibit B control.

2.

If either no gas well permit is issued or drilling activity has not commenced on the property described in Exhibit A within one year after the date of City Council approval, the Specific Use Permit shall expire, unless the director of Community Development and Planning grants an extension as provided in Section 5-500(F) of the Zoning Chapter of the Arlington City Code.

3.

Any person, firm, corporation, agent or employee thereof who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined an amount not to exceed Two Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$2,000.00) for each offense. Each day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

4.

This ordinance shall be and is hereby declared to be cumulative of all other ordinances of the City of Arlington; and this ordinance shall not operate to repeal or affect any of such other ordinances except insofar as the provisions thereof might be inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, in which event such conflicting provisions, if any, in such other ordinance or ordinances are hereby repealed.

5.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

6.

All of the regulations provided in this ordinance are hereby declared to be governmental and for the health, safety and welfare of the general public. Any member of the City Council or any City official or employee charged with the enforcement of this ordinance, acting for the City of Arlington in the discharge of his/her duties, shall not thereby render himself/herself personally liable; and he/she is hereby relieved from all personal liability for any damage that might accrue to persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of his/her said duties.

7.

Any violation of this ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the City of Arlington in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this ordinance or in the Code of the City of Arlington.

8.

The caption and penalty of this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Arlington, Texas, in compliance with the provisions of Article VII, Section 15, of the City Charter. Further, this ordinance may be published in pamphlet form and shall be admissible in such form in any court, as provided by law.

9.

This ordinance shall become effective upon second publication.



EXHIBIT "A"

BEING a tract of land situated in the Pickney Caldwell Survey, Abstract No. 364, City of Arlington, Tarrant County, Texas, and being a portion of that certain tract of land described by deed to LNC Holdings, Inc. (Tract II), as recorded in Volume 11001, Page 2383, Deed Records, Tarrant County, Texas and being more particularly described by the metes and bounds as follows:

COMMENCING at the northeast corner of said Tract II, in the west right-of-way of Carter Street (a 60-foot right-of-way), the beginning of a non-tangent curve to the right;

THENCE to a found 5/8-inch iron rod in the west right-of-way of said Carter Street and with said right-of-way and said non-tangent curve to the right, an arc distance of 198.98 feet, through a central angle of  $19^{\circ}00'03''$ , having a radius of 600.00 feet, the long chord of which bears South  $11^{\circ}11'06''$  West, 198.07 feet;

THENCE South  $22^{\circ}48'38''$  West, 200.82 feet with said right-of-way;

THENCE North  $90^{\circ}00'00''$  West, 145.74 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING;

THENCE South  $48^{\circ}48'47''$  West, 149.20 feet;

THENCE South  $89^{\circ}53'00''$  West, 342.89 feet;

THENCE North  $00^{\circ}04'51''$  West, 393.30 feet;

THENCE North  $89^{\circ}53'00''$  East, 455.31 feet;




THENCE South  $00^{\circ}04'51''$  East, 295.28 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING and containing 3.984 acres of land more or less;

And be generally located south of East Pioneer Parkway and west of South Watson Road with the approximate address being 2351 East Arkansas Lane.



EXHIBIT “B”


1. Operation of a gas drilling use must comply with all requirements in the Gas Drilling and Production Chapter of the Arlington City Code.
2. At the permit stage, a Road Damage Assessment Study is required to mitigate any impacts to the street system during drilling.
3. At the permit stage, all required tree mitigation will be met.
4. Within 60 days after the first drilling phase is complete, a solid masonry wall, a minimum height of eight-feet, shall enclose the operation site. After completion of all wells, landscaping shall be provided along all four sides on the outside of the masonry wall in accordance with the submitted site plan. Landscaping shall consist of trees and shrubs which must be chosen from the Texas Smartscape List. One tree shall be provided every 35 linear feet and shrubs shall be spaced no greater than three feet on center. A detailed landscape plan and plant schedule must be provided upon drilling permit submittal. The property owner shall be responsible for the installation, preservation, and maintenance of all landscaping and physical features shown on this site plan.
5. The property owner shall be responsible for the installation, preservation, and maintenance of all landscaping and physical features shown on this site plan.
6. Before fracing operations, a sign shall be installed to notify the public of the time the operator intends to frac on the subject site, at least one week in advance of fracing operations.
7. Use and development of the property must be in compliance with the attached Site Plan (one page).
8. In the event of a conflict between the provisions in this Exhibit B and any other exhibits to this ordinance, the provisions of Exhibit B control.

1. SPECIFIC USE PERMIT FOR GAS DRILLING USE.
  2. SITE GRADING WILL NOT ALTER THE NATURAL FLOW. A SILT SOCK (SEE DETAIL) WILL BE INSTALLED AS NECESSARY.
  3. THE ACCESS DRIVEWAY /ROAD WILL BE OFF OF CARTER DRIVE.
  4. THE ACCESS ROAD IS 24' WIDE WITH 14' OVERHEAD CLEARANCE.
  5. WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE FIRST DRILLING PHASE IS COMPLETED, A SOLID MASONRY WALL WITH A MINIMUM HEIGHT OF EIGHT (8') FEET, SHALL ENCLOSE THE OPERATION SITE. UPON COMPLETION OF ALL WELLS, LANDSCAPING (SEE DETAIL) MUST ENCLOSE THE OPERATION SITE. A MINIMUM OF ONE (1) GATE THAT IS TWELVE (12') FEET WIDE MUST BE INSTALLED. LANDSCAPING SHOULD CONSIST OF TREES AND SHRUBS WHICH MUST BE CHOSEN FROM THE TEXAS SMARTSCAPE LIST. ONE TREE SHALL BE PROVIDED EVERY 35 LINEAR FEET AND SHRUBS SHALL BE SPACED NO GREATER THAN THREE FEET ON CENTER. A DETAILED LANDSCAPE PLAN AND PLANT SCHEDULE MUST BE PROVIDED UPON DRILLING PERMIT SUBMITTAL.
  6. THE PROPERTY OWNER SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE INSTALLATION, PRESERVATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF ALL LANDSCAPING AND PHYSICAL FEATURES SHOW ON THIS SITE PLAN.
  7. ALL REQUIRED TREE MITIGATION WILL BE MET AT THE PERMITTING STAGE.
  8. THE PROPOSED WATER SOURCE FOR DRILLING AND FRACING OPERATIONS IS WATER PURCHASED FROM THE CITY. EXISTING ADJACENT WATER INFRASTRUCTURE WILL BE UTILIZED.
  9. THE PROPOSED PIPELINE CONNECTION IS TO THE EXISTING DFW MIDSTREAM NORTH ARLINGTON PIPELINE LOCATED IMMEDIATELY SOUTH OF THE PROPOSED PAD SITE.
  10. BEFORE FRACING OPERATIONS, A SIGN SHALL BE INSTALLED TO NOTIFY THE PUBLIC OF THE TIME THAT THE OPERATOR INTENDS TO FRAC ON THE SUBJECT SITE.

THENCE N 90°00'00"W, 145.74 feet to the point of beginning;

THENCE S 48°48'47"W, 149.20 feet;

THENCE S 89°53'00"W, 342.89 feet;

THENCE N 00°04'51"W, 393.30 feet;

THENCE N 89°53'00"E, 455.31 feet;

THENCE S 00°04'51"E, 295.28 feet to the Point of Beginning and containing 173,564 square feet or 3.984 acres of land more or less.

THE SIGN SHALL INCLUDE THE PHONE NUMBER FOR EMERGENCY SERVICE (911), THE NUMBER FOR THE OPERATOR, AND THE WELL DESIGNATOR REQUIRED BY THE RAILROAD COMMISSION IN FOUR INCH (4") LETTERING.
