

Perr Drill Site Permit Stipulations

1. A sign will be displayed at the gate stating the well number, the name and number of the operator, the emergency 911 number, and the telephone numbers of two contacts.
2. The ambient noise level for this site is established at 53.8 dBA. During drilling, the allowable nighttime sound level is 56.8 dBA and the allowable daytime sound level is 58.8 dBA. Fracing operations shall not exceed 60.8 dB.
3. The approved water site plan limits the rate of withdrawal to a maximum of 600 gallons per minute (gpm) from one hydrant and 800 gpm from the other, as shown on the water site plan.
4. Traffic access to the Perr Drill Site commences at Interstate 20 Highway (I-20). From I-20, take the Cooper Street (FM 157) north exit and travel approximately 1.75 miles north to the existing site entrance driveway on the east side of Cooper Street. To exit from the site, turn right from the entrance driveway and drive north on Cooper Street approximately 0.85 miles to Pioneer Parkway.
5. Carrizo shall coordinate with TXDOT and staff and possibly change the trans. Route based on TXDOT construction.
6. Traffic will be restricted from 7:00 -9:00 am and 4:00-6:00 p.m.
7. Per Ordinance specification, after completion of all wells, a solid masonry wall with a minimum height of eight feet and landscaping must enclose all completed wells and tanks located within the operation site.
8. Landscaping shall be installed prior to drilling, Landscaping should consist of trees and shrubs which must be chosen from the Texas Smartscape List. One tree shall be provided every 35 linear feet and shrubs shall be spaced no greater than three feet on center. The property owner shall be responsible for the installation, preservation, and maintenance of all landscaping and physical features shown on this site plan.
9. The entire parcel surrounding the SUP site and up to the adjacent right-of-way is considered the development for enforcement purposes of landscaping requirements. This site requires a minimum ten-foot landscape setback and must be installed prior to drilling in accordance with the approved landscape plan.
