

SWAPPO Drill Site Permit Stipulations

1. A sign will be displayed at the gate stating the well number, the name and number of the operator, the emergency 911 number, and the telephone numbers of two contacts.
2. Site development, other than drilling, shall be conducted only between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.
3. During drilling, the allowable nighttime sound level is 3 dBA over ambient and the allowable level during daytime hours is 5 dBA over ambient. Fracing operations shall not exceed 7 dBA over ambient.
4. All noise levels shall be measured at the well setback distance. Due to the proximity of protected uses, the exterior noise shall be continuously monitored in one-minute intervals and forwarded to the City daily.
5. Lighting shall be directed away from all residential uses.
6. The approved water site plan limits the water withdrawal rate to a maximum of 800 gallons per minute at the locations approved.
7. Landscaping must be installed as approved on the landscape site plan.
8. To screen the site from U.S. 287 Highway (US 287), the landscaping along the roadway should be installed prior to drilling.
9. Pipeline appurtenances, if visible from US 287, must be effectively screened with landscaping.
10. Development of the adjacent Tree Point Park is planned to retain natural vegetation near the drill site. As a condition of approval, Carrizo must work with the City of Arlington's Parks Department regarding landscaping plans on the west side of the site.
11. The transportation route commences at US 287. From US 287, travel north to the Texas turnaround at Little Road and continue onto the southbound US 287 frontage road. Travel south on the frontage road to the site's entrance road on the right. Travel south from the site along the frontage road to gain access back to US 287.
12. On-site equipment is subject to placement requirements per the identified MFF on the plat.
13. A five-foot clearance between the proposed fence and the 60-foot drainage easement along the south property line is required.
14. Any water tap less than six inches cannot tie into a 16-inch water main. The water meter location for irrigation must connect to an existing fire hydrant.
