



Proposition 1 | Street Improvements | \$160,130,000

Residential Rebuild Program

\$40,150,000

This funding would allow for the design and reconstruction of residential streets in multiple areas of the City that have deteriorated beyond general maintenance and are not funded by the sales tax for street maintenance.

Eden (US 287 to Calender)

\$15,000,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition and reconstruction of Eden Road between US 287 and Calender Road along with installation of curbs, gutters, underground drainage, streetlights and sidewalks.

Matlock (Bardin to Green Oaks)

\$14,400,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition, reconstruction and widening of Matlock Road between Bardin Road and Green Oaks Boulevard from four lanes to six lanes.

Turner Warnell (Matlock to Cooper)

\$13,655,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition, reconstruction and widening of Turner Warnell Road between Matlock Road and Cooper Street from two lanes to four lanes along with the installation of curbs, gutters, underground drainage, streetlights and sidewalks.

Collins (SH 303 to Park Row)

\$11,000,000

This funding would allow for the design and reconstruction of Collins Street between State Highway 303 and Park Row Drive.

Avenue E (SH 360 to Great Southwest)

\$8,200,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition and reconstruction of Avenue E between State Highway 360 and Great Southwest Parkway.



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Harris (Cooper to Calender)

\$8,200,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition and reconstruction of Harris Road between Cooper Street and Calender Road along with installation of curbs, gutters, underground drainage, streetlights and sidewalks.

Avenue H (SH 360 to Great Southwest)

\$8,000,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition and reconstruction of Avenue H between State Highway 360 and Great Southwest Parkway.

Calender (Harris to Eden)

\$5,850,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition and reconstruction of Calender Road between Harris Road and Eden Road along with installation of curbs, gutters, underground drainage, streetlights and sidewalks.

Timberlake (SH 303 to Park Row)

\$5,700,000

This funding would allow for the design and reconstruction of Timberlake Drive between State Highway 303 and Park Row Drive.

Sidewalk Program

\$5,575,000

This funding would allow for the design and reconstruction of existing sidewalks that can no longer be repaired by general maintenance and the construction of new sidewalks and ramps.

Signal/ITS Annual Program

\$5,475,000

This funding would allow for construction of traffic signals and other ITS (Intelligent Transportation System) devices such as electronic message boards and traffic management cameras.

Pleasant Ridge (I-20 to Enchanted Bay)

\$5,100,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition and reconstruction and widening of Pleasant Ridge Road (currently Bowman Springs Road) between Interstate 20 and Enchanted Bay Drive from two lanes to four lanes along with the installation of curbs, gutters, underground drainage, streetlights and sidewalks.

Poly Webb (Pleasant Ridge to Shorewood)

\$3,200,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition and reconstruction of Poly Webb Road between Pleasant Ridge Road and Shorewood Drive along with installation of curbs, gutters, underground drainage, streetlights and sidewalks.

SH 360 Connections

\$3,200,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition and realignment of the New York Avenue/Eden Road intersection with future State Highway 360 and the design, right-of-way acquisition and construction of a connection to the future State Highway 360 north of Webb Lynn Road.

Collins (Mayfield to I-20)

\$2,900,000

This funding would allow for the design, right-of-way acquisition reconstruction and widening of Collins Street between Mayfield Road and Interstate 20 from four lanes to six lanes.

Materials Testing Program

\$1,875,000

This funding would allow for the testing of materials and methods during roadway construction.

Pleasant Ridge (Plumwood to Enchanted Bay) \$1,200,000

This funding would allow for the design and right-of-way acquisition for future Pleasant Ridge Road between Plumwood Drive and Enchanted Bay Drive.

Bowen/I-20 Texas U-Turn

\$615,000

This funding would allow for the design and construction of a Texas U-turn at Bowen Road from the westbound Interstate 20 frontage road to the eastbound Interstate 20 frontage road.

Grant Matching Funds

\$500,000

This funding would allow for required city matching funds for state-issued intelligent transportation systems devices grants.

Irrigation Repair Program

\$335,000

This funding would allow for the relocation or repair of irrigation systems that are in conflict with roadway construction.



Proposition 2 | Parks & Recreation | \$60,000,000

Southeast Recreation/Aquatic Center

\$25,000,000

This funding would allow for design and construction of a recreation center and aquatic facility at Webb Community Park in southeast Arlington.

Recreation Center Portion of Hugh Smith Recreation Center/East Library

\$19,500,000

This funding would allow for design and construction of a new Hugh Smith Recreation Center and Indoor Pool, which will be co-located with a new East Arlington Branch Library.

Harold Patterson Sports Center Renovations

\$4,000,000

This funding would allow for phase two improvements at the Harold Patterson Sports Center, including reconstruction of lighted soccer fields, concession/restroom facilities, restrooms and parking lots.

Ditto Golf Course Renovations

\$3,000,000

This funding would allow for priority renovations as identified in the Ditto Golf Course Master Plan.

Randol Mill Park Renovations

\$1,000,000

This funding would allow for renovation of the basketball/tennis courts and parking lots, dredging of the pond and playing surface replacement on the Doug Inman Miracle Field.

River Legacy Parks Renovations

\$1,000,000

This funding would allow for reconstruction of aging parking lots, trail sections and erosion repairs along the trail system.

Julia Burgen Park Phase II

\$1,000,000

This funding would allow for phase two improvements, including construction of a parking lot, pavilion, picnic stations, playground, trails and pedestrian bridges.

Park Land Acquisition

\$1,000,000

This funding would allow for acquisition of park land in the highest priority service gap areas.

Helen Wessler Park Renovations

\$800,000

This funding would allow for creek restoration and installation of a pedestrian bridge over Cottonwood Creek.

Village Creek/Bob Findlay Linear Park Renovations

\$600,000

This funding would allow for reconstruction of aging trail sections and replacement of entry signs at both parks.

Bowman Springs Park Renovations

\$600,000

This funding would allow for renovations of the playground, restrooms, pavilion and parking lot.

California Lane Park Renovations

\$600,000

This funding would allow for renovations of the sprayground and playground and for construction of a restroom facility.

Deaver Park Renovations

\$500,000

This funding would allow for renovations of the trail, playground and entry sign and for dredging of the pond.

Rush Creek Dog Park

\$500,000

This funding would allow for construction of an off-leash dog park per the Rush Creek Mitigation Plan at the former Willows Condominium site on Pioneer Parkway.

Cravens Park Renovations

\$500,000

This funding would allow for renovation of the pavilion, dredging of the pond and installation of a water well for ballfield irrigation.

Brantley Hinshaw Park Renovations

\$400,000

This funding would allow for renovations of the sprayground and pavilion.



Proposition 3 | Fire Facilities | \$9,780,000

Station #1 Reconstruction


\$5,276,500

This funding would allow for the reconstruction of Fire Station 1.

Fire Training Center Improvements

\$4,503,500

This funding would allow for replacement of and upgrades to the training facilities at the Fire Training Center.



Proposition 4 | Libraries | \$6,090,000

Library Portion of the Hugh Smith Recreation Center/East Library Project

\$5,695,000

This funding would allow for design and construction of a new East Arlington Branch Library, which will be co-located with a reconstructed Hugh Smith Recreation Center.

Woodland West Library Remodel

\$395,000

This funding would allow for remodeling of the entryway and addition of approximately six hundred square feet to the Woodland West Library.

The amounts identified for each project are estimated amounts and the City of Arlington may reallocate the amounts among the various projects listed or substitute other projects of a similar nature in accordance with the respective bond proposition.
